ARMY ROTC SCHOLARSHIPS

Whether you are a college-bound high school student or already attending a college or university, Army ROTC and JSU ROTC have scholarships that are available. Scholarships are awarded based on a student's merit and grades, not financial need.

Army ROTC Scholarships consist of:

- Four-, three-, and two- year scholarship options based on time remaining to complete your degree
- Full-tuition scholarships
- The option for room and board in place of tuition, if you should qualify
- Additional allowances for books and fees (\$600/term)
- · Monthly Stipend of \$420

JSU ROTC offers 3 different scholarships:

- Meal
- Dorm
- Alumni Scholarship

If you want to pursue a civilian career at the completion of college and still participate in a Reserve Component, you may be eligible for a Guaranteed Reserve Forces Scholarship or Dedicated Army National Guard.

- Up to 2 years of tuition or Room/Board (GRFD)
- Up to 3 years of tuition or Room/Board (DEDANG)

Minimum requirements to compete for a scholarship:

- Between ages 17-26
- High School GPA 2.5 / College 2.5
- High School diploma or equivalent





THE SIMULTANEOUS MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM (SMP)

If you are already in the National Guard or Reserve, this alternative to scholarships may be for you. These Cadets are enrolled in Army ROTC and a Reserve component while attending college. A few of the benefits of this program is:

- \$5,000 Room and Board -- Scholarship Cadets Only
- \$1,000 per year for books -- Scholarship Cadets Only
- \$362 per month GI Bill
- \$350 per month SMP Kicker *If you qualify
- $\bullet 265 month drill pay for contracted Cadets
- \$1,200 *2 weeks annual training

The ROTC program is open to students who are:

- Undergraduates
- Transfer Students
- Entering Graduate School
