INTRODUCTION

The Drama & Performing Arts collection is adequate to support the courses taught in the Bachelor of Arts program. Complete conspectus sheets and checklists are available upon request for a more detailed examination of the collection.

HOLDINGS

The Drama & Performing Arts collection contains **8,361** titles in the GV 1541-1561 GV 1580-1860 and PN 1560-3307 call number ranges, including 4,629 e-books. Total monograph expenditures for Drama & Performing Arts from FY 2017/18 to FY 2021/22 were **\$35,812.37** with 574 new titles added. These newer additions comprise 7% of the current Drama & Performing Arts collection.

These numbers represent a snapshot of the collection as titles are continually being added and withdrawn for collection maintenance and growth. These numbers do not represent additional titles available through e-book databases.

PERIODICALS AND SERIALS

The Library has access to full-text journals available throughout the Library databases. There are over 260 journals available electronically through database subscriptions, which can be found in EBSCO's Publication Finder at http://bit.ly/2z06DjD. The Serials expenditures in Drama & Performing Arts for both print and electronic subscriptions and standing orders average \$4,619.52 from FY 2017/18 to FY 2021/22 (see table below.)

The collection also supports minors in Drama and Film and Entertainment Technology. The Drama & Performing Arts collection is adequate to support the courses taught in the bachelor's program. SUMMARY

Strengths:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate the overall Drama & Performing Arts collection is more than adequate to support the curriculum. Of note on the conspectus worksheet are the holdings in the subject areas of: The Performing Arts & Show Business with a 23.4% increase, Art of Acting with a 9.4% increase, Television Broadcasts with a 9.3% increase, and Motion Pictures with a 9% increase since the last assessment.

A review of the journal holdings reveals that the Drama & Performing Arts collection is adequate to support the curriculum.

Weaknesses:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluations, and checklist comparisons indicate that the least collected areas within the Drama & Performing Arts collection continue to be Renaissance, Medieval, and Ancient Theatre. However, it should be noted that these are not areas of focus for the department, so the low collection totals are less troubling than the numbers reflect.

Recommendations:

The growth rate of the Drama & Performing Arts Collection should be maintained to continue providing support for the majors and minors in both Theater and Film. The monograph collection should be generally increased, based on budget, with a continued focus on collecting core and outstanding titles. The periodical collection available via databases is substantial and should be maintained. The less collected subject areas (noted above) should also be addressed with additional acquisitions as determined by academic need and budget allowances.
