Katherine Newman- Ms. Newman has been performing extensively in the southeast both as a recitalist and orchestral harpist for many years and is currently Principal Harpist for the Huntsville Symphony. Recently she was featured soloist in a performance of Mozart's Concerto for Flute and Harp.

She also plays regularly with the Alabama Symphony in Birmingham including their performances at the Kennedy Center. For years Ms. Newman was Principal Harpist for the Mobile Opera Orchestra and she has developed an extensive teaching studio in northern Alabama.

Ms. Newman divides her time between her southeast activities and performances in the Washington metropolitan area. For example, she performs with the St. Mary's Orchestra in their summer series and the Alexandria Symphony on many occasions.

Ms. Newman earned both her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in harp at Auburn University. Additionally, she is currently teaching several courses in Music Appreciation at a local college.

New JSU Student Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association

JSU Director of Choral Activities, Dr. Patricia Corbin, who also serves on the Alabama ACDA board as College & University Repertoire and Standards Chair, is responsible for starting this chapter and is its adviser. "ACDA has fabulous conventions every year and I haven't missed one since 1995," says Dr. Corbin. "They are life changing events for those of us who are passionate about choral music," she continues, "I wanted to have some of my JSU students share in this experience."

In addition to sponsoring the fall food drives, the chapter is raising money to attend the ACDA National Convention that will be held in Dallas, Texas, March 13-17, 2013.
