A group of political science students considered protesting recent tuition hikes at their college. In order to find out what kind of support they could expect, they conducted a survey of the student body. They asked 120 of the total 3,000 students at the college these questions:

Do you oppose recent tuition hikes?
 Yes 70% No 30%
 If Yes, answer questions 2 and 3.

2. Would you sign a petition in protest?

Yes 50% No 50%

3. Would you participate in a strike?
Yes 20% No 80%

Which conclusion is best supported by the results of the student survey?
