

What is Jax MIX

A signature general education program where you develop your human potential with engaging faculty in courses that merge innovation & experience.

- Categories: All gen ed courses organized into four categories: Expression, Inquiry, Experience, Communication

- Badges: Students who complete microcredentials earn badges they can use to convey skills to employers.

Faculty Takeaways:

- Gen ed faculty are not responsible for changing existing course content to fit into a Jax MIX Focus
- Faculty are not expected to advise students on Jax MIX progress, focuses, or microcredentials
- Faculty should have a basic understanding of Jax MIX and encourage students to contact academic advisors with questions
- Faculty teaching gen ed courses might consider adding Jax MIX language to general education syllabi. Faculty Commons can assist with template language for courses that ARE included in a focus and classes that ARE NOT included in a focus

The default password for MyJaxState is J- followed by your six-digit date of birth and the last four digits of your student ID number in the format J-MMDDYY####.


MyJaxState uses Single Sign On (SSO) to sync your account information with GEM, therefore you will use the same password to access your GEM and MyJaxState.








Financial Aid Verification

The panic button sends your information directly to the Campus Police Department and is monitored 24/7. The panic button has three options when selected. All three options will send your information to UPD. The first option also calls UPD at 256-782-5050. The second option is for emergencies off-campus; it will send your information to UPD and calls 911. The last option is a silent alert that sends your information to UPD and is for situations you may not be able to talk on the phone.

Grades to Banner Integration

Beginning with Summer 2024 term, Banner will use the Intelligent Learning Platform (ILP) to create Canvas course shells and enroll faculty and students into courses. When records are created

or updated in Banner, they will be updated immediately in Canvas as those changes occur. Most notably, during open grading, faculty will have the ability to submit grades directly from Canvas to Banner using the "Grades to Banner"

functionality. This consists of reviewing/modifying the pre-populated letter grades, entering any required last dates attended, and then pushing a button to submit grades to Banner, thus eliminating multiple entry. Please note that faculty may still choose to enter grades into Self-Service Banner (SSB) manually if they desire.

Benefits of Grades to Banner

- Banner creation of course shells
- Real-time updates for enrollments (faculty and students), users, and courses
- Grade push from Canvas to Banner, eliminating the need for multiple entry (except for dual enrollment numerical grades)
- Additional features for the MyJaxState portal experience (coming soon!)


The JSU Navigate platform aims to increase retention and graduation rates by improving student achievement and engagement. Developed by the Education Advisory Board (EAB), the program combines technology, research, and predictive analytics to help institutions positively change outcomes with at-risk and off-path students, helping JSU reach our graduation and retention goals. JSU has begun to implement and utilize Navigate, a student success management system the brings together advisors, faculty, support staff and students to create a coordinated care network that enables targeted intervention and proactive, strategic support for every JSU student.

JSU Navigate will allow advisors, faculty, and staff the ability to:

- View a comprehensive student academic overview to provide quick, personalized guidance.
- Identify and prioritize students in need of support who require the most urgent attention.
- Maintain and share notes from student appointments and interactions.
- Set appointments with students and send email and text appointment reminders.
- Track advising appointments and walk-in traffic.
- Communicate with students directly from the platform.
- Run campaigns to reach out to students based on specific criteria and easily schedule and track appointments.
- Issue alerts on students needing additional support.

Right side of screen (usually under your photo), look for Quick Links, Record Class Attendance.

Use the Filter Course, Location, Professor box to type your last name to narrow down the options.

Click the link to Record Class Attendance. A window will appear with your class roster. Mark students accordingly. Make comments as needed. An email will be sent to the student notifying them that they were marked absent or tardy unless you mark excused before submitting the report

Issue a Warning:

Right side of screen (usually under your photo), look for Issue an Alert/Referral.

A new window will appear that will allow you to search for a student.

Tip: After you select the student's name, use the drop down box to select your class. This helps especially if the student has a common name. Then go to the field to select the reason. You can select more than one.

ADJUNCT DEPARTMENTAL LIFE DEPARTMENT HEAD ADVICE



Dr. Gina Mabrey Department Head, Kinesiology

Dr. Mabrey has served in various and diverse roles at Jacksonville State University (JSU) throughout her tenure. Upon completion of her Master's degree at Auburn University in December 1993, she began teaching at JSU in January 1994 within the College of Education's Health, Physical Education, and Recreation (HPER) Department as an adjunct instructor then obtained full-time faculty status along with the role of Wellness Coordinator in 2006. In the coordinator role, she managed all aspects of University faculty and staff wellness programming including administering stress/fitness testing, fitness assessments, exercise prescription, wellness counseling and education, designing, implementing, and promoting the wellness program. As a dedicated faculty member, she was appointed to chair of JSU's Exercise Science & Wellness (ESW) undergraduate program where she spearheaded the restructuring of the ESW curriculum to better serve students. Dr. Mabrey's leadership role was expanded in 2013 when she was selected as Department Chair for HPER, which was later renamed the Department of Kinesiology in 2014 through her efforts. Dr. Mabrey has excelled in the areas of scholarship and service through her work on numerous college and university committees as well as

Dr. McKerchar began her career at the University of Florida's Florida Center on Self-Injury and the Kennedy Krieger Institute before attending the University of Kansas for doctoral training. Through these experiences, she has provided applied behavior analysis services to children and adults across the lifespan in home, school, center, work, and residential settings. She is a former member of the editorial board for Behavior Analysis in Practice and has served as a guest reviewer for the Journal of Applied Behavior Analysis and other behavior analytic journals. Her most recent work has been in promoting best practice in behavior analysis through university training and public policy changes. To this end, she secured ABAI accreditation for Jax State's master's program in Applied Behavior Analysis in 2012 and has helped the program remain accredited through 2028. At the state level, she served as the Executive Director of the Alabama Association for Behavior Analysis from 2012-2024, led efforts to pass Alabama's licensure legislation in 2014 & 2017, and served as the first chairperson of the Alabama Behavior Analyst Licensing Board from 2014-2020. Dr. McKerchar has been a Psychology professor at Jax State since 2007 and served as head of the Psychology Department since 2012.
