## 2024-2025 Federal TEACH Grant Request

In exchange for receiving a TEACH Grant, you must agree to serve as a full-time teacher in a high-need field in a public or private elementary or secondary school that serves low-income students (see below for more information on high-need fields and schools serving low-income students). As a recipient of a TEACH Grant, you must teach for at least four academic years within eight calendar years of completing the program of study for which you received a TEACH Grant.

**IMPORTANT**: If you fail to complete this service obligation, all amounts of TEACH Grants that you received will be converted to a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan. You must then repay this loan to the U.S. Department of Education. You will be charged interest from the date the grant(s) was disbursed. TEACH Grant recipients will be given a 6-month grace period prior to entering repayment if a TEACH Grant is converted to a Direct Unsubsidized Loan.

#### **Student Eligibility Requirements**

- Completed FAFSA for the aid year you are requesting the TEACH Grant
- Maintain Financial Aid Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)
- Be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen.
- **Undergraduate** students **(1**st **Bachelor's)** or **Alternative Class A Graduate** Students: Be unconditionally admitted in the School of Education, having met the Teacher Education Program Eligibility Requirements, in a TEACH Grant major, meet and maintain a cumulative overall GPA of at least a **3.25**.
- **Graduate** students: (Master's Degree only, Educational Specialist students are not eligible):
  Be unconditionally admitted in the School of Education, having met the Teacher Education Program Eligibility
  Requirements, in a TEACH Grant major, meet and maintain a cumulative overall GPA of at least a **3.25**(First time traditional graduate students must score in the 75th percentile on the MAT/GRE/GMAT)

Please note that TEACH grant amounts are prorated based on enrollment and you must be full-time to receive the full amounts. Please see below for amounts.

- Full Time (12+ hours) = \$1,886
- 3/4 Time (9-11 hours) = \$ 1,415
- $\frac{1}{2}$  Time (6-8 hours) = \$943
- Less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  Time (>6 hours) = \$472

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
