The incorporation of Quality Assurance and Quality Control into Crime Scene Investigations will be the emphasis of this 8 hour block of training. Participants will be introduced to sterile techniques that should be utilized when documenting and collecting biological samples.

At the completion of training, participants will be issued a Crime Scene Kit containing supplies to document and collect potential items of evidence.

Participation is limited to rural Police Departments and Sheriff's Offices in Alabama. Maximum number of attendees from any agency is 2.
