on your acceptance to Jacksonville State University! We are glad to have you as part of the JSU Family. This booklet contains information regarding mandatory orientation and registration for Summer Semester 2022. Orientation provides useful information about the University and offers an opportunity to meet other new students, current JSU students, faculty members, and staff. Students attending orientation must attend all meetings in order to register for classes.

ORIENTATION ELIGIBILITY & REGISTRATION

Orientation is **required** for first-year students under the age of 25 and strongly **encouraged** for all first-time transfer students. To be eligible to attend orientation, students must have received an official letter of acceptance from the Office of Admissions (www.jsu.edu/admissions). To make reservations, follow the registration information located in the back of this brochure.

- Orientation Fee: The non-refundable fee must be received in order to confirm your reservation for orientation: \$80

JSU STUDENT IDENTIFICATION NUMBER

Each student is assigned a JSU identification number upon acceptance to the university. This number is located at the top of your acceptance letter. Student ID cards are made in the office adjacent to the mail center on the fourth floor in the TMB. Anyone wishing to acquire a JSU ID Card must be currently enrolled at the university and present proof of identification before the card can be issued. You will receive your ID card at orientation. You will use this number to reference your personal student information when contacting an office on campus. It is strongly recommended that you memorize this number.

FINANCIAL AID

Students may use their scheduled financial aid (assistance that has been processed, awarded, and accepted), with the exception of federal work study, to confirm class registration. Financial aid status and awards may be verified on MyJSU. **Financial aid awards and scholarships do not cover the orientation fee.** See our student check list below:

DINING SERVICES

All university dining is managed by Sodexo Dining Services which provides a variety of flexible meal plans available for both resident and commuter students. If you live on campus in Crow, Curtiss, Dauge, Dixon, Fitzpatrick, Logan, Patterson, Meehan, or Sparkman Hall, your JSU account will automatically be billed for the plan and you will need to choose from the options listed. If you do not choose a plan you will be placed on the default plan of ten meals per week with \$400 flex. UNIVERSITY HOUSING

First-year undergraduate students are required to live on campus inside the residence halls, however, we do allow students to request exemptions. If you are a student from Calhoun, Cherokee, Cleburne, Etowah, St. Clair, or Talladega county and do not wish to live on campus, you must submit a request for exemption online or you will be enrolled in housing. Assignments are made according to the date of application, receipt of \$200 non-refundable application fee, and space availability. Every attempt is made to honor requests; however, assignments are not guaranteed. Applications cannot be processed without the \$200 application fee. Housing move-in date is May 13, 2022. All assignment information will be sent to your JSU email address. Housing applications are available online only; paper applications are not available. JSU EDREADY MATH & ENGLISH PLACEMENT:

JSU wants to save you time and money by offering the NO COST, INDIVIDUALIZED JSU EdReady Math Placement and English Placement!

WHO TAKES JSU EDREADY?

All first-year students and transfer students who have not completed their first required math and/or English course are required to take EdReady.

HOW TO TAKE JSU EDREADY MATH/ENGLISH PLACEMENT:

- 1 Take test at home before your Gamecock Orientation session.
- 2 Disable pop-up blockers. (Chrome and Firefox recommended)
- 3 Log-in to your MyJSU Account. (Received in JSU acceptance letter)
- 4 Click on "Placement Exams."
- 5 If the pop-up appears, click "Get Started." (Do not enter a key)
- 6 Choose the exam you would like to take first (JSU Math Placement or English Placement).
- 7 Next Click "Go to Goal."
- 8 Click "Start Assessment."
- 9 Take this assessment and submit your results. You will immediately be given a score and a study path.
- 10 If you do not make the required minimum placement score, you should work on your study path to achieve the required score.
- 11 Repeat steps 3-10 to complete the second EdReady (Math or English).
- 12 You are encouraged to work both English and Math study paths to a score of 100.

WHEN SHOULD I COMPLETE JSU EDREADY MATH & ENGLISH PLACEMENT?

- You should complete EdReady as soon as you receive your acceptance letter to JSU.
- The deadline to complete EdReady is two weeks before your scheduled orientation date.

ENGLISH PLACEMENT

All new students take English EdReady and work their study paths to a score of 90 for college preparation. Students without ACT/SAT scores may use their Initial English EdReady Score for placement.

First-Year Writing Course	ACT/SAT English Subtest Score	English EdReady Initial Score
EH 105/EH 115	17 and below ACT 420 and below SAT	55 and below
EH 101	18 and above ACT 430 and above SAT	56 and above
EH 103	25 and above ACT 610 and above SAT	71 and above

After working the English EdReady study path to a score of 90, students who place into EH 105 and wish to move to EH 101, or students who place into EH 101 and wish to move to EH 103, may take an additional self-assessment to be considered. MEDICAL INFORMATION & IMMUNIZATION

Medical information and immunizations:

All students admitted to JSU for the first time must meet the JSU Immunization Requirements and submit proof of immunization via medproctor.com.

- **MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)** | Students born after 1956 -2 doses of MMR at least 28 days apart after 12 months of age OR a copy of a lab report showing proof of immunity from measles (rubeola), mumps, and rubella can be submitted in lieu of the vaccine.
- **VARICELLA (Chickenpox/Shingles)** | Students born after 1979- 2 doses of Varicella vaccine at least 28 days apart OR healthcare provider documented history with the date of the disease (or documented history of chicken pox by provider).
- **HEPATITIS B** | Three doses are required for all students or a blood test showing immunity. All students will be required to have all three doses of the hepatitis B vaccine as outlined in the following schedule. The second dose should be at least 28 days after the first dose and the third dose at least 16 weeks after first dose and at least 8 weeks after the second dose. If there is no time to complete a series before enrollment, an appointment may be made at the SHC when the next dose of vaccine is due.
- **TUBERCULOSIS SCREENING** | All students are required to complete the Tuberculosis Screening questions. Further tuberculosis testing may be required based upon information received from the screening questions. Students who are screened and found to have a positive screening test will not be permitted to attend classes until follow-up testing determines there is no active Tuberculosis disease. All TB testing must be performed in the United States.
- All students must register with medproctor.com as soon as possible after receiving their JSU email address. Submission of records requires the JSU email address.
- The Student Health Center advises all adults to be properly immunized. If your classes are fully online and you will not be on campus, you may request consideration for exemption by waiver.
- You should submit an Appeal for Exemption from Immunization for each vaccine requirement that is not met, regardless of the reason. You will need to submit a signed statement of medical exemption from your primary care provider to studentaffairs@JSU.edu. This confirms with your health care provider if your “medical reason” is based on current information.
- You may also be exempt from immunizations due to your religious beliefs. In this case, you should submit an Appeal for Exemption from Immunization, explaining how immunizations conflict with your religious beliefs. This statement should be submitted to studentaffairs@JSU.edu.
- Students that have not completed the immunization requirements by the first day of class will be assigned a default temporary waiver and asked to schedule an appointment at the Student Health Center. Students that default into a non-compliance waiver, may be prohibited from registering for classes the following semester.

PARKING DECAL

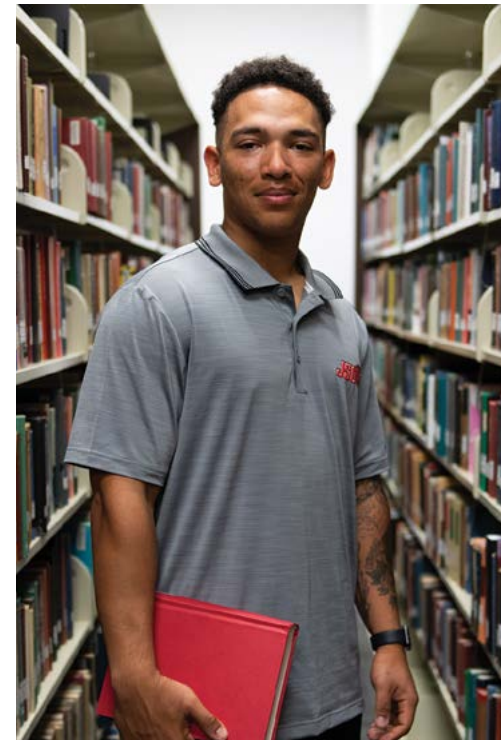
- **Vehicle Parking Decal** | Parking decals are required for all vehicles parked on campus. You register for parking decals online at my.jsu.edu under the “Student” tab. The \$50 decal fee* can be charged to a credit card added to the student’s account, or be paid at the cashier window in Angle Hall on the 2nd floor at the Office of Student Accounts. After online registration, a decal will be mailed to the registered address, unless you have a Jtag (JSU customized license plate), which will require decal pick up at UPD.

EMAIL ACCOUNTS

- **MYJSU** | MyJSU is Jacksonville State University’s portal that provides access to JSU web-based services and information. Use MyJSU for class registration, financial aid, paying tuition, checking grades, and more. Please visit jsu.edu/it/services/accounts/index.html for all info on how to log in to MyJSU.
- **GEM** | You can access your JSU email through GEM from the main webpage. This is where all official JSU information will be sent. Please check your GEM account regularly. Be sure to download the Microsoft Office Outlook App for GEM access on your phone. Once a student is enrolled in classes, they will have access to Microsoft Office Word, Excel, OneNote, PowerPoint, and OneDrive (1TB of online storage). You can download the office package on up to five devices.

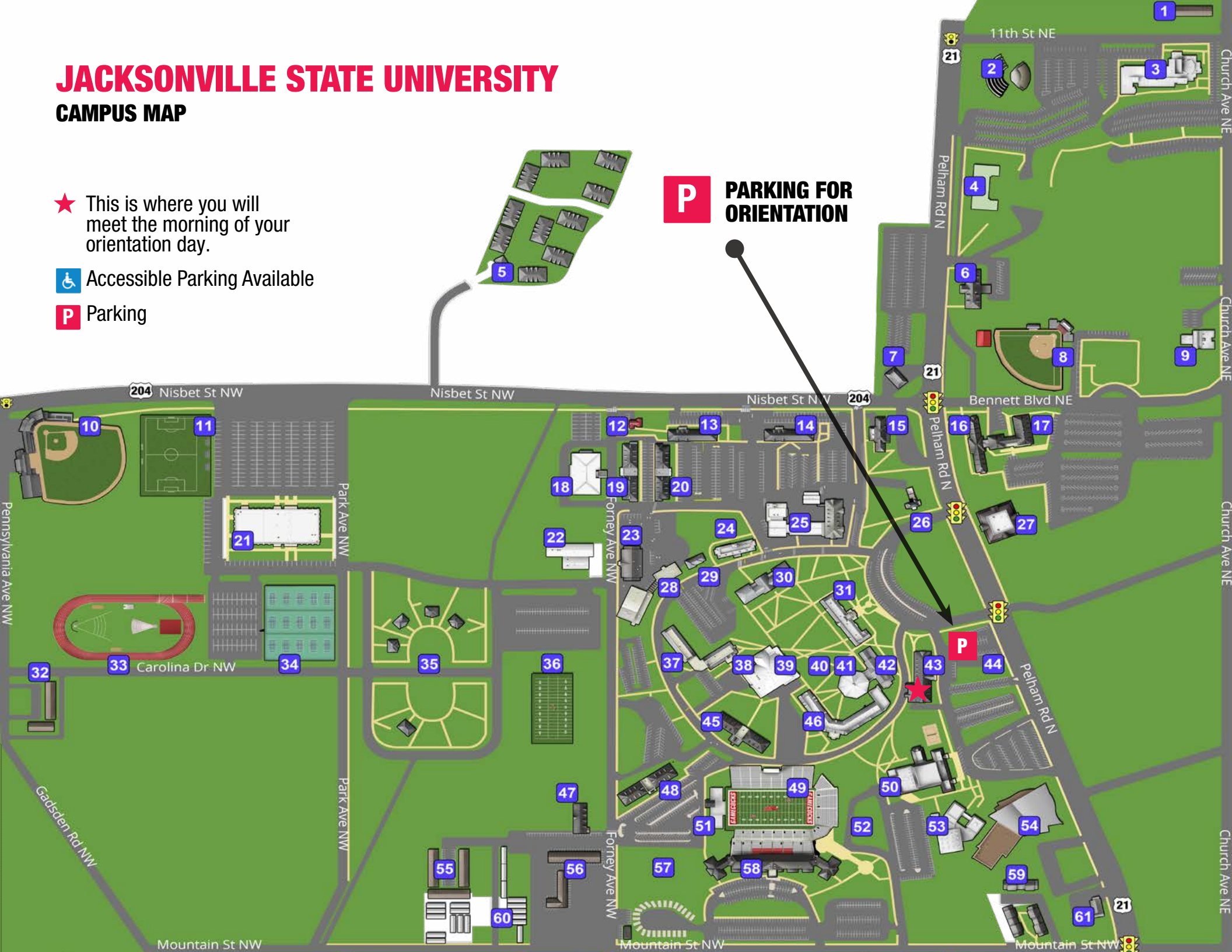
CAMPUS MAP
