- High School completion with GPA of 2.5/4.0 or College GPA of 2.5/4.0 if student has attended college.
- Must demonstrate maturity, high respect and appreciation for cultural diversity and different perspectives.
- Agree to participate in the events and activities of the International House for the duration of your membership.
- Respect the international house and everyone in it all times.
- Duration of Program: 1 semester to 2 years (Fall and Spring).
