


Spring 2009 Enrollment 8,753

Enrollment by College




Enrollment by Gender






Enrollment by Status



Undergraduate Enrollment 7,315


Undergraduate students make up **84%** of JSU's total Spring 2009 enrollment.

Enrollment of Undergraduate Students is up by **248** students from Spring 2008.




Graduate Enrollment 1,438


1438 graduate students make up 16% of JSU's total enrollment.
