






## Enrollment by College

## Enrollment by Status






# Undergraduate Enrollment 6,961

Undergraduate students make up **88%** of JSU's total Spring 2014 enrollment.


## Undergraduate Enrollment by Gender and Status




## Undergraduate Enrollment by Gender




## Undergraduate Enrollment by Status



## Undergraduate Enrollment by Classification






# Graduate Enrollment 987

Graduate students make up **12%** of JSU's total enrollment.


## Graduate Enrollment by Gender and Status




## Graduate Enrollment by Gender



## Graduate Enrollment by Status






# Distance Education
