



Enrollment by College




Enrollment by Status


Enrollment by Gender




Undergraduate Enrollment 6,910

Undergraduate students make up **88%** of JSU's total Spring 2016 enrollment.


Undergraduate Enrollment by Gender and Status




Undergraduate Enrollment by Gender




Undergraduate Enrollment by Status



Undergraduate Enrollment by Classification








Graduate Enrollment by Gender and Status




Graduate Enrollment by Gender



Graduate Enrollment by Status






Distance Education
