


### Student Body Distribution by Gender and Full-Time, Part-Time Status





**7,067** undergraduate students make up **82%** of JSU's total enrollment.


#### Full-Time, Part-Time




#### Gender




### Enrollment by College




### Undergraduates by Gender, Full-Time Part-Time
