While many concepts can be carried over to other weapon systems, this course focuses on the duty pistol.

Course topics include:

- How the brain learns and develops skills
- Practice methods that maximize performance
- Applying Performance Science to firearms training
- Coaching techniques and strategies
- Developing hand dexterity and vision skills
- A principle-based approach to marksmanship
- A shooter-friendly framework for marksmanship
- Effective dry practice principles
- Diagnosing and prioritizing marksmanship errors
- A new brain-based approach to target analysis
