INTRODUCTION

The American History collection is adequate to support the courses taught in the Bachelor's program and Master's program. Complete conspectus sheets and checklists are available upon request for a more detailed examination of the collection.

HOLDINGS

The American History collection contains **64,530** titles in the E-F call number ranges, including **12,101** e-books. Total monograph expenditures for American History from 2019-2025 were **\$126,052.93** with **1,458** new titles added. These newer additions comprise **2%** of the current American History collection.

These numbers represent a snapshot of the collection, as titles are continually added and withdrawn for collection maintenance and growth. These numbers do not represent additional titles available through e-book databases.

There are over 267 journals in American History or related areas available electronically through database subscriptions. These can be found in EBSCO's Publication Finder http://bit.ly/20xb9HY. Of the 267 journals available within American History topics, 170 of those are peer-reviewed journals (http://bit.ly/2KIH2we). The Serials expenditures in American History for both print and electronic subscriptions and standing orders average \$24,908.50 from 2019-2024 (see table below.)

The American History Collection also supports study for degree programs in the Bachelor of Arts in Integrated Studies with a concentration in History, and Bachelor of Science in Secondary Education – General Social Studies. The collection also supports the graduate certificates of Teaching College U.S. History and Teaching College World History offered by the Department of History and Foreign Languages. The American History collection is adequate to support the courses taught in the Bachelors' programs and the Master's program. Through partnerships, such as the one with the Alabama Virtual Library (AVL), the Library can obtain more content. Resources provided to the Library by the AVL are designated with the AVL icon.

SUMMARY

Strengths:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluation, and checklist comparisons indicate the overall American History collection is more than adequate to support the curriculum. Of particular note on the conspectus worksheet are the holdings in the subject areas of: History- Americas (General Indian N. America), History- United States (Colonial, Special Topics), History- United States, General Works, History- United States (Slavery & Civil War), U.S. - Confederate States of America, History- United States (Since the Civil War), U.S.- Twentieth Century, 1945-, U.S. - State & Local history - Atlantic Coast, U. S.- State & Local History- Gulf States, and History-South America.

A review of the journal holdings reveals that the American History collection is adequate to support the curriculum.

Weaknesses:

Total holdings, conspectus evaluations, and checklist comparisons indicate that the weakest areas of the American History subject areas are Guatemala- Colonial, 1535-1821, Guatemala-Independence & Revolution to 1945, Guatemala- 1945 to present, Caribbean, West Indies (except Cuba) National, Colombia- Local History & Description, Venezuela- Colonial, Venezuela- National, Venezuela- Local History & Description, Paraguay- Colonial, Uruguay- Colonial, Uruguay- Local History & Description, Argentina- Colonial, Chile- Colonial, Bolivia- Colonial, Bolivia- Local History & Description, Peru- Nineteenth Century, Ecuador- Colonial, Ecuador- National, and Ecuador- Local History & Description.

Recommendations:

The growth rate of the American History Collection should be maintained to provide support for the Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts as well as the Minors in History, Asian Studies, Gender Studies, and Latin American Studies. It should also be maintained to provide support for degree programs in the Bachelor of Arts in Integrated Studies with a concentration in History, and Bachelor of Science in Education. The monograph collection should be generally increased, based on the Library budget. The periodical collection available via databases is substantial and should be maintained. The weak subject areas (noted above) should also be addressed in future additions to the collection.
