Course Template Definition

What is a course template?

- A framework, or outline with consistent course structure and organization within the Canvas Course Shell (Modules and Pages)
- Can also contain consistent structure/organization within Pages, Assignments, and Discussions
- Can also contain consistent program/college information

Enabling DesignPLUS (legacy version) in Canvas

Steps

- 1. Login to one of your courses
- 2. Go to any Canvas page (just pick one)
- 3. Click on the Edit button to edit the page
- 4. Then....

PC or Mac

- 1. PC: on your keyboard, hold down Alt-Shift-D
- 2. Mac: on your keyboard, hold down Option-Shift-D

Steps

- Click on the launch button icon – it's a rocket ship
- 2. The full launch bar will appear click on it.
- 3. The Design Tools app will open. Click on the gear icon to the far right of the menu bar at the top.

Steps

- 1. Select/enable "Show launch button"
- 2. Do not enable "Automatically launch tools" this will drive you crazy!
- 3. Next to "Select a Comfort Level" click on "Advanced".
- 4. Scroll down under Current Element Style and make sure everything is enabled.
- 5. Close out the "Design Tools Settings" box.

Create/Edit Content Options

- 1. Copy Existing Content
- 2. Add/Rearrange Content Blocks
- 3. Choose a Theme
- 4. Customize Banner Text
- 5. Choose a Banner Image
- 6. Course Content Links

Create/Edit Content > Choose a Theme

Choose the Theme First

- Before you add content blocks, click on Create/Edit Content.
- Then, click on Choose a Theme and select a theme.
- You can add content blocks after you select the theme.
- There are themes for basic pages and front pages (home pages).

Add Content Blocks

Add Content Blocks

- Choose content blocks after you select your theme. (You can change your theme at any time.)
- There are several pre-set content blocks, but you can create unique ones.

Adding Content Blocks



Create/Edit Content > Add/Rearrange Content Blocks

Add/Rearrange Content Blocks

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- After selecting your theme and content blocks, you can rearrange them (drag and drop) or delete them and add/change icons.
- 1 Add/Rearrange Content Blocks
- 2 Drag and Drop content blocks in different order
- 3 Click on the icon or blank square next to the content block title and add an icon or change one
- 4 Click on the "x" next to a content block title to delete it

Adding/Rearranging Content Blocks



Create/Edit Content > Add/Rearrange Content Blocks > Icons

To add or change icons to a content block

- After you add a content block, click on Create/Edit Content Blocks
- Click on Add/Rearrange Content Blocks
- 1 Click on the blank box or icon next to the content block title
- 2 The Custom Icons popup box will appear
- 3 Search for Icons, OR

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• 4 – Choose by category

Multi-Tool

What is Multi-Tool?

- Multi-Tool is another "tool" that is packaged with DesignPLUS.
- Enable it by clicking on Settings > Navigation > Enable Multi-Tool > Save
- The first time you enable it you will be asked to authorize permission.
- We will focus on Template Builder.
- You can use Template Builder and Design Tools in conjunction.

Create a Template Page

• Click on Template Builder

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- 1 Next to Page Title, type in the name of the template page. In the example, I have typed "Overview."
- 2 click on the +Create Template Page button

Template Page

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- The template page will appear under "Existing Templates."
- In the example, [Template] Overview page has been created.
- Click on it to open it for editing.
- A blank Canvas page called [Template] Overview will load.
- Now, begin using Design Tools to add your page elements.

Multi-Tool > Create an Overview Page Template

Now, use Design Tools

- 1. Click on the Design Tools launch button
- 2. Click on Create/Edit Content
- 3. First, select your theme.
- 4. Second, click on the +Add Content Blocks button.
- 5. Add your content blocks.
- 6. In the example, I added the objectives, readings, and assignments content blocks. I created my own introduction block to make the design consistent and add an icon.
- 7. Remember to save the page.

Add Template to a Canvas Page

Create an Overview Page

- Use the Overview Template page to create an Overview Page for Module 1 in your course.
- Go to the Modules page and create Module 1.
- 1 Click on Add and choose Page.
- 2 Select Create Page.
- 3 Name your page.
- 4 Click on the Add Item button.
- When you see it in the module, click on it to go to the page and click on the Edit button.

Create Overview Page for Module 1



Add Overview Template page to Module 1 Overview page

Add the Template

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- Click on the Edit button to edit the page.
- Click on the Design Tools launch button to open it.
- 1 Click on Create/Edit Content.
- 2 Click on Copy Existing Content.
- 3 Under Template Pages, click on Select a page.
- 4 Select the [Template] Overview page created earlier.
- The template will embed in the Module 1: Overview page.

Insert template into the page



Now, you can edit the page by adding Module 1 Overview content

Add Your Content

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- Now, you can begin editing the Module 1: Overview page by adding Module 1 Overview information introduction, module objectives, course readings, and assignments.
- Repeat the process again when you want to create more module overview pages – Module 2: Overview, Module 3: Overview, etc.
- HOWEVER if you want to quickly create module overview pages for all of your modules BEFORE you add content, navigate to the Modules page and find the Module 1: Overview page. Click on the ellipsis next to it and select "Duplicate."
- "Duplicate" will allow you to quickly create duplicates of the page so that you can quickly edit each page to add the content for each module.
