

# Update from LTC Travis Easterling, Gamecock Battalion Professor of Military Science

#### **Enrollment**

The JAX SATE ROTC is continuing to grow. We had one of the largest recruiting classes in the Brigade, and we are on track to surpass that number for the Fall 2024 semester. We are on track to commission

over twenty 2LTs this year. JAX hasn't commissioned that 2LTs in well over a decade and we are forecasted to exceed our commissioning mission for the next several years. It's amazing to see the progress the program has made in a few short years. We were once considered to be a non-viable program, but now we are postured to be viable for the foreseeable future.

#### **Camps and Schools**

Continuing the JAX SATE tradition of strong performance at camp, our Cadets performed in the Top 30% of Cadets at Advanced Camp last year.

CDT Carlie Benefield excelled at Air Assault School. She was the first female to finish the 12-mile Ruck March. JAX ROTC had three Cadets attend CTLT. Kendejah Traylor traveled to Joint Base Lewis McChord Washington, Tion Wright traveled to Schofield Barracks Hawaii, and Toni Wright traveled to Vincenza, Italy. All three enjoyed their CTLT experience.

#### **Scholarships and Academic Awards**

Two of our MSIV's earned the title of Distinguished Military Graduates. This honor recognizes them for being in the top 10% of Cadets nationwide. CDT Sturges was ranked in the Top 2% in the nation and CDT Mccord was ranked in the Top 7% in the nation. CDT Sturges also earned the RECONDO Badge.

Our freshmen Cadets received a total of 9 three and four-year scholarships valued in excess of \$500,000.

One of our Cadets received a four-year Army Reserve Minuteman scholarship from the Civilian Aide to the Secretary of the Army valued in excess of \$58,000.

CDT Addison Parton was selected to participate in the Project Global Officer campaign. She spent 58 days living with a family in Taiwan where she learned Mandarin Chinese.

### Recruiting

JAX State was selected, for the third straight year, to host the Alabama JROTC drill competition. The competition will be held on 23 March, and over 30 High Schools have RSVP'd to the competition. To put that in perspective. Last year, 8 schools and between 300-500 Cadets participating in the competition. With 30 schools competing, we are expecting up to 1,500 students to be on campus for the competition. That is not including parents, Cadre, or relatives. The competition could easily be the largest recruiting event not only for the ROTC program but the University. Both Dr. Killingsworth and Dr. Shelton are excited that JAX was selected to host the competition.

JAX's ROTC program had another great year with branching. All but one Cadet received the component they requested, and all Cadets got one of their top three branch choices.

LTC Easterling has already made contact with his replacement, LTC Walker, who will be coming to us from Germany. LTC Walker is a Troy graduate, but his wife is from Pleasant Valley. He will sign into JAX at the end of June.
