Military Alumnus of the Year

Nominations are open for the 2022 Military Alumnus of the Year.

The criteria for consideration as the Military Alumnus of the Year are:

- Must be a graduate of JSU
- Must be an officer on active duty or active in the National Guard or Reserves, Must join or be a member of the JSU Alumni Association
- Must play an active role in promoting the university
- Must have shown outstanding military achievement
- Must be able to attend Homecoming to receive the award.

Nominations for Military Alumnus of the Year award may be submitted from any source but are due by 1 April 2022 and must be accompanied by a written biographical sketch and photo. The individual is selected by consensus of the Chapter's Board, and the President will notify the individual of the selection. The President also notifies the JSU National Alumni Association.
