## student GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION

#### What is SGA?

The Student Government Association has been serving the students of JSU since 1946. The SGA houses the SGA Executive team, Student Senate, Student Activities Council, and Organizational Council. The five executive officers work together as a team to serve the students of JSU through hosting student activities, passing legislation on behalf of students, assisting in the creation and record-keeping processes of registered student organizations, publicizing all functions of student life, and advocating on behalf of the students to the JSU administration and Board of Trustees.

#### There are 5 SGA Executive Council Officers:

- The SGA President regularly meets with JSU President, attends Board of Trustee Meetings, and advocates for the JSU student body.
- The SGA Vice President of Student Senate oversees Student Senate, who passes legislation for the betterment of the JSU student body.
- The SGA Vice President of Student Activities plans and implements student events and leads the Student Activities Council which is the organization that carries out the events of the SGA and the Dean of Students Office.
- The SGA Vice President of Organizational Affairs works with all of the Registered Student Organizations at JSU, and is the head of the Organizational Council.
- The SGA Vice President of Public Relations works with the Dean of Students Office and promotes university events and programs.

SGA Exec holds regular weekly office hours, and can be located in the Theron Montgomery Building (TMB) 4th floor in the Dean of Students Office. Feel free to stop by the office, and they can help you get involved!

Jacksonville State University has long been known as a university dedicated to helping first-generation students fulfill their dreams of attaining a college degree. But the university is also providing substantial financial support to this special population of students.

Jax State is implementing a plan to improve its support programs for first-generation students, focused on the following goals:
