The purpose of the Dean of Students Office is to help students enhance their collegiate experience by providing co-curricular programs and activities. Our goal is to help students find their home at Jax State. Research shows that student involvement is positively associated with academic achievement. Similar research states that student involvement is a direct indicator of students' sense of belonging. The Dean of Students office gathered data in Fall 2024 and Spring 2025 relating to sense of belonging. 97% of responses reflected that students felt a sense of belonging at student events. This sense of belonging is known to help students develop academically and socially. WHAT IS SGA?

The Student Government Association has been serving the students of Jax State since 1946. The SGA houses the SGA Executive team, Student Senate, Student Activities Council, and Organizational Council. The five executive officers work together as a team to serve the students of Jax State through hosting student activities, passing legislation on behalf of students, assisting in the creation and record-keeping processes of registered student organizations, publicizing all functions of student life, and advocating on behalf of the students to the Jax State administration and Board of Trustees.



THERE ARE 5 SGA EXECUTIVE COUNCIL OFFICERS:

- **THE SGA PRE/IDENT** regularly meets with the Jax State President, attends Board of Trustee Meetings, and advocates for the Jax State student body.
- THE SGA VICE PRE/IDENT OF STUDENT SENATE oversees Student Senate, who passes legislation for the betterment of the Jax State student body.
- THE SGA VICE PRE/IDENT OF STUDENT ACTIVITIE/ plans and implements student events and leads the Student Activities Council, which carries out the events of the SGA and the Dean of Students Office.
- THE SGA VICE PRE/IDENT OF ORGANIZATIONAL AFFAIRJ works with all of the Registered Student Organizations at Jax State, and is the head of the Organizational Council.
- THE SGA VICE PREJIDENT OF PUBLIC RELATIONJ works with the Dean of Students Office and promotes university events and programs.

SGA Exec holds regular weekly office hours, and can be located in the Theron Montgomery Building (TMB) 4th floor in the Dean of Students Office. Feel free to stop by the office, and they can help you get involved!

STUDENT SENATE

Jax State's Student Senate consists of 30 voting senators. Student Senators write bills and resolutions, lead volunteer initiatives, and advocate for the students of Jax State. Senate meetings occur every Monday at 6:00PM in the Theron Montgomery Building Auditorium. Student Senate meetings are open to all students. Stop in to stay up to date on the SGA Student Senate.
